Here's what you need to know:

FasTrak® Toll Tags Are Required for All Express Lane Users

The I-580 Express Lanes improve your commute along the Tri-Valley corridor through Dublin, Pleasanton, and Livermore.



Carpoolers (and others eligible to use carpool lanes)

A FasTrak Flex toll tag is required for toll-free use of the Express Lanes.

- Open a FasTrak Flex account at www.bayareafastrak.org.
- Mount your FasTrak Flex toll tag. Before driving, set it to ② or ③ for toll-free travel.
- You are ready to go!

Note: To receive carpool discounts at toll bridges, you must use a designated carpool lane.

FasTrak Flex toll tags can be used at any toll facility in California displaying the FasTrak logo.

Solo Drivers

A FasTrak toll tag is required. You may use your existing FasTrak or the new FasTrak Flex.

- Open a FasTrak account at www.bayareafastrak.org.
- Mount your toll tag on your vehicle's windshield. If using Flex, set it to (1) before driving.
- You are ready to go!

What are the I-580 Express Lanes?

The I-580 Express Lanes are designated lanes that are toll-free for carpools, vanpools, motorcycles, buses and eligible clean-air vehicles as long as they carry a FasTrak® Flex toll tag set to ② or ③. Solo drivers can choose to pay a toll using a FasTrak or FasTrak Flex toll tag to access the lanes for reliable travel times.

Are they easy to use?

Yes! The I-580 Express Lanes look and feel similar to carpool lanes. You can enter and exit almost anywhere along the nearly 14-mile corridor, providing easy access to and from local exits.

When do the lanes operate and how much do they cost to use?

The express lanes will operate Monday through Friday, 5am to 8pm. All other times the lanes are open to all users with no toll and no toll-tag requirements. Overhead signs display the current toll (for solo drivers). The cost will vary based on congestion levels and the distance traveled in the express lanes.
